Planning and Highways Committee 2024/2025

Minutes of the Planning and Highways Committee Meeting held on 24th July at 7.00pm at Sedbury and Beachley Village Hall, King Alfred's Road, Sedbury.

1. ATTENDANCE

- **b.** Resolved to note matters arising from those minutes. There were none.

4. PUBLIC CONSULTATION

There were no members of the public present.

5. TO CONSIDER CORRESPONDENCE RECEIVED RE: PLANNING ISSUES

Resolved to note the contents of the Forest of Dean District Council Draft Local Plan 2021-2041, Regulation 18 Consultation and for the Assistant Clerk to write to the Forest of Dean District Council listing comments on behalf of the committee. Councillors discussed that the Local Plan was ambitious with 845 houses proposed for Beachley, Sedbury and Tutshill, and that the climate emergency is a lead principle in the many policies listed. Councillors also discussed that there are some difficult questions that have not been addressed around infrastructure (schools, GP surgeries, pharmacies, etc), road network (current congestion, road improvements, safe crossings, etc) and active travel (footpaths, cycle paths, rural bus connections, etc). The parish has already seen a large number of new houses built in recent years and if a further 845 houses are to be considered then significant improvements in infrastructure, road network and active travel must be agreed beforehand.

7. TO CONSIDER PLANNING APPLICATIONS RECEIVED

a. P0100/24/FUL – Land South of Hanley Farm Tidenham.

Proposed dog training facility, comprising of an outdoor and an indoor space alongside associated access, parking, landscaping and works. (REVISED SCHEME).

Tidenham Parish Council supports the amended application.

b. P0778/24/LBC – Day House, Tidenham, Chepstow, NP16 7LH.

Listed building consent for the erection of vertically boarded timber fence sub-dividing the site, erection of external boiler and flue to rear entrance porch, erection of concrete ramp to rear entrance porch, reconstruction of lean-to rear range. Removal of rear door off the through passage and infilling of opening in concrete blockwork, blocking up at first floor of four panelled door to rear range with blockwork leaving blockwork visible through door, removal of doorway and blocking up of second opening at first floor into rear range leaving blockwork exposed. (Retrospective).

Tidenham Parish Council supports this application.

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c. P0774/24/FUL – 2 Orchard Farm Close, Sedbury, Gloucestershire, NP16 7BG.

Erection of first-floor side extension.

Tidenham Parish Council supports this application.

a. P1466/23/FUL – Tallards Marsh Cottage, Offas Close, Sedbury, Chepstow.

Erection of replacement garage with room above. Demolition of existing garage.

b. P0003/24/FUL – Chase End, Tidenham Chase, Chepstow, NP16 7JN.

Conversion and alteration of the existing garage annex building to create a garden room and home office with lightweight glazed link to the main house.

Full permission.
